SINGLE-STREAM RECYCLING! **We're making recycling easier for you.**

During the week of June 29, 2009, each community in Outagamie County, including all of Appleton and New London, will start single-stream recycling.

What is single-stream recycling?

- You may now combine your mixed paper and containers (aluminum, tin, plastic and glass) into one recycling bin. You may continue to use the same bins that you have used in the past.
- Single-stream does **not** mean trash may be mixed with your recyclables, only that your paper and container recyclables may be mixed together.

It is still important to follow the same guidelines that you have in the past.

- Please have your recyclables placed at the curb the night before, or by 6:00 a.m. on your day of pick up.
- Not all plastic is recyclable. Please be sure the symbol on the container is #1 or #2 and the neck is smaller than the base. Engine oil bottles and ice cream pails are not accepted.
- Please **do not** place recyclables in **plastic bags**, including shredded paper.
- Cardboard should be flat and no larger than 3' x 3' in size.
- Be sure recycling containers are placed at least 4 ft away from trash containers and secured on windy days.
- This program is for **residents** only.

Single-stream offers communities the option to move to an automated cart system to collect recyclables.

- Automated carts allow for ease of collection, an increase of materials collected and cleanliness of your neighborhood.
- Your local municipality will decide whether carts will be used.
